Questions & Discussion	<p><u>Opioid Supplement</u></p> <p>Goal: Recommendation from AC on whether to continue or drop the Opioid Supplement (OS)</p> <p>Presentation highlights:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• DOH added OS in 2019, along with 24 other PRAMS sites; in 2022 only 6 sites continued• 5.3% of respondents reported PPR use in WA; a small minority reporting misuse• Interesting preliminary data on source of PPR; counseling received; perceptions of harm• Slower rate of prenatal care initiation among PPR users• Only population-based survey data on prescription pain reliever (PPR) use and misuse among pregnant people. New questions in Phase 9 could support addt'l analyses about experiences with providers, mental health, discrimination, racism, etc• Substance use is primary contributor to maternal mortality in WA• Challenges: long survey, no federal funds for OS; small numbers prohibit some analyses <p>Feedback:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Lots of interest in presentation, interest in sharing slides with teams• HCA & WSU are submitting a Legislative Report for Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome; request made for copy of report to share out with PRAMS AC• Potential interest from UW students <p>Recommendation: Continue with Supplement</p> <p>Note: Had some difficulties with final Poll vote; however, no one voted to Drop, majority voted to Continue, 2 were unsure.</p> <p><u>PRAMS Participant Recruitment</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• New promotional materials developed for WA PRAMS – Flyer, Brochure, and Poster. Will be posted on website



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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Unweighted WA PRAMS response rates presented, showing continuing decline in participation despite introduction of web option in 2023. • Some differences in rates presented by demographics (age, race/ethnicity, WIC status, insurance, geography) <p>Small Groups: identify 3 or more recruitment ideas</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Partner with community groups – NHPI • Partner with community organizations that already serve the communities - Doulas, Home Visiting, WIC • Look for opportunities to distribute materials thru hospitals, MCOs, ACH • Create Script for Staff on how to promote PRAMS to their constituents, make it easy for Staff to advocate for responses • Advertise online – very short social media postings. Can post on DOH SM site, target to specific groups • Identify other multi-agency groups and share QR code and blurb to include in their newsletters, etc – DCYF, Prenatal-to-Three, Perinatal Collaborative, Pregnancy, Infancy and Early Childhood (PIE)
